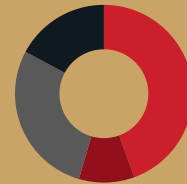

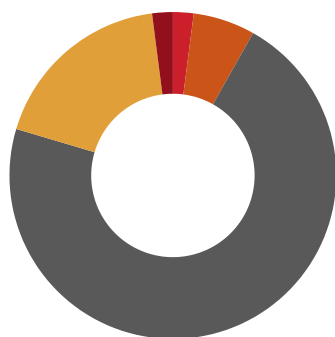

POSITIVE CLIENT OUTCOME

Legal Aid represented a client who was being evicted for falling behind on rent. This client had medical issues and was on a fixed income. After reviewing the lease, our attorney noticed that the landlord was responsible for the electric bill, but the client had been paying that utility for close to a year. Legal Aid was able to get the landlord to withdraw the eviction and give the client enough credit to pay the two months of rent owed plus the following month's rent.
